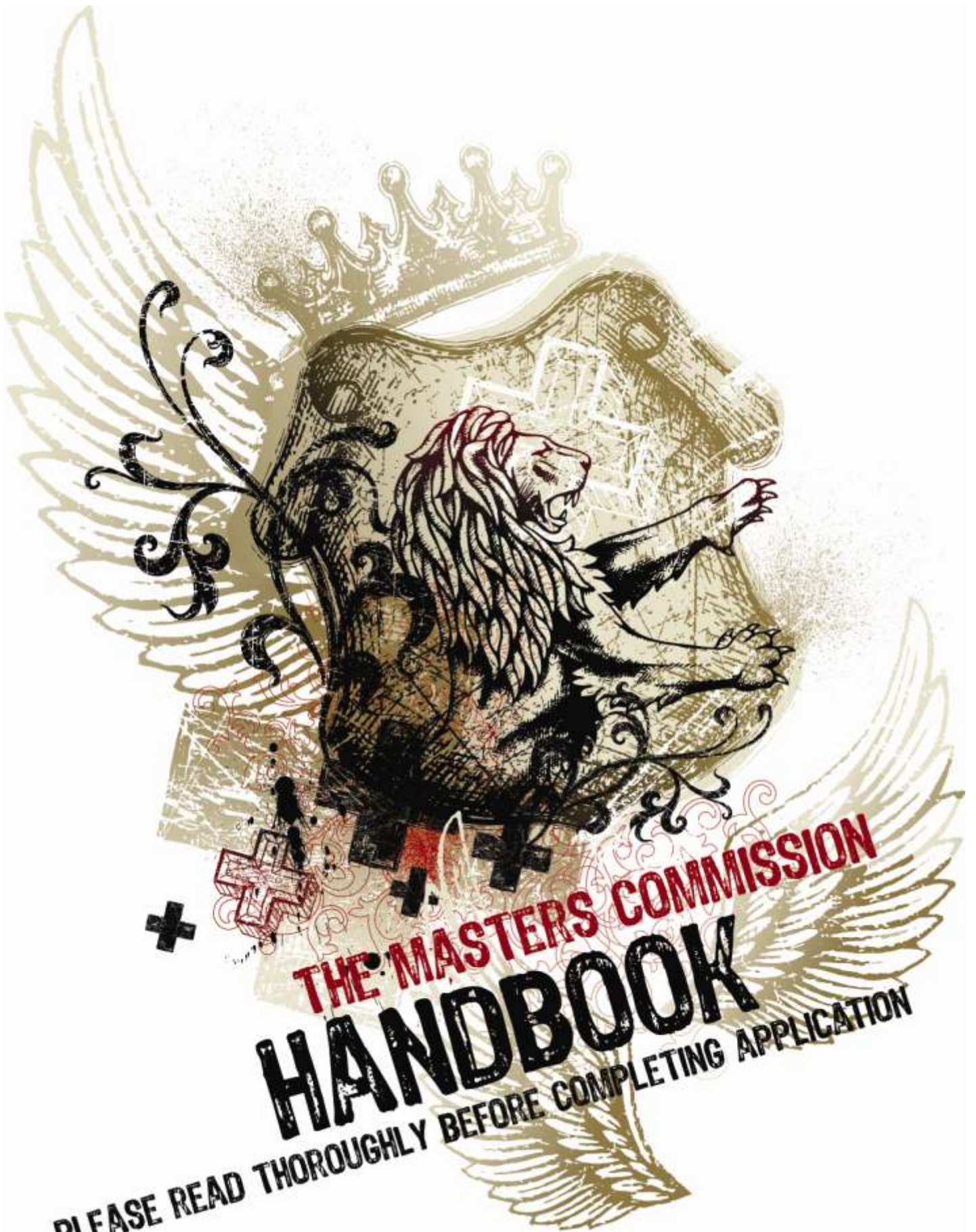

INTRODUCTION

It is the conviction of the leadership and members of Christ Church Kirkland that there is ultimately but one Master who gave us His Great Commission. The Master is Jesus, the Son of God, our Lord and Savior. His Great Commission commands us to "...go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19)

Young people who have chosen to enter the **Master's Commission** are choosing to dedicate one year of their lives to God in full-time service and discipleship. It is our fervent prayer that they will take their place in the body of Christ to join in the work of the Great Commission. In the end, may it be said of them that they are "...vessels of honor, sanctified, useful to the Master, prepared for every good work." (2 Timothy 2:21) This is truly the **Master's Commission!**

GOALS FOR MASTER'S COMMISSION GRADUATES

- To have a Christ-centered lifestyle rather than a self-centered one.
- To have an undistracted relationship with the Lord that is real, life-giving, intimate, and daily.

- To have a conviction and a desire to represent the Lord accurately in every situation.
- To have a correct view of who God is as a loving, caring Father and as a ruling King.

- To deal with any performance mentality so that they would be who God created them to be no matter what others may say or do.
- To have the heart of a servant.
- To have a vision and revelation of joining the generations together, and generational transfer so as to further the purposes of God on the earth.
- To be transformed more into the image and character of Christ and to develop a love for transformation.
- To be self-examining, self-revealing, and self-feeding.
- To have the desire to be discipled and to disciple others.
- To become a self-disciplined person. To have all procrastination, apathy, and laziness dealt with. To have a godly work ethic with a pursuit of excellence.

- To speak effectively, and be equipped to share the Gospel message through personal testimony and teaching Biblical truths.

MASTER'S COMMISSION CORE VALUES

Christ Centeredness: With Christ being the motivation of all we do, we will produce true value. He is the One we model our lives after, and so He is the one whom all of our values must be derived from. Keeping Christ as the center of our lives prevents our pursuits from revolving around the promoting of self, and enables us to be purposeful and productive sons and daughters of the Kingdom.

Generational Vision: God's heart is for joining the generations, and generational transfer is the very means by which He determined His purposes to be extended throughout time. Generational transfer is an issue of the heart. It enables us to embrace the responsibility to impart to the ones coming behind, the life and deposit of Christ entrusted to us by preceding generations.

Fathering: God's plan from the beginning was that His truth was to be taught and lived out in the context of family. The students in the Master's Commission don't live in dormitories, but stay in host homes. They are surrounded by spiritual mothers and fathers who speak identity into them, and provide a safe place for them to grow and learn. As they learn to become mature sons and daughters, relationships in their own families are impacted and blessed.

Discipleship: God's pattern for spiritual growth and maturity has always involved the need for mentors and those willing to be mentored. A discipleship relationship enables life purpose and destiny to be discovered and defined. The pattern of discipleship provides the context for accountability, self-discipline, and spiritual authority.

Covenant: Walking in right relationship with God, and with His people, means being a people of covenant, who walk openly before each other and God, establishing relationships that are built on firm principles and agreements that will last a lifetime.

Christ-like Character: What we build with our giftings can easily be destroyed by our lack of character. As Christ's life and character is the pattern for us to follow, the Master's Commission is committed to training up those who live lives of service, love, sacrifice, faith, obedience, and genuine joy.

Representation of Christ: Everything we do, is to be done with all of our might and as unto the Lord. Therefore, we endeavor to be those whose excellence in faith, work ethic and passion, represent Christ accurately.

Leadership: Those who serve, lead, and are given positions of increasing influence. Leadership training is accomplished in the Master's Commission through practicing servanthood and laying down one's life for their friends. Practical training in leadership principles is experienced throughout the year.

Training in "The way" of the Lord: There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death, and a lack of fruit. God has a way for us to live, and He has given us His word, His Holy Spirit, and each other, to discover it. His way makes it possible to live lives that are Spirit-led and undistracted in our devotion to Christ. We seek His way so that we can walk in His enabling grace, and live lives of holiness and righteousness unto Him.

SCHEDULE AND CURRICULUM

DAILY SCHEDULE (This is the usual schedule, but flexibility is a key.)

1. Morning Schedule:

8:00 – 9:30	Worship and Prayer
9:30 – 12:00	Class Time

2. Afternoon Schedule:

12:00 – 1:00	Lunch (provided by student)
1:00 – 5:00	Outreaches
	Drama & Arts Practice
	Service Projects

This schedule is applicable from Tuesday through Friday of every week. Monday of each week will be a day of rest for the student. Specific areas of need, ministry, or recreation will be assigned to students for Saturdays and Sundays. In the evenings, Tuesday through Sunday, students will be expected to complete homework assignments, keep other commitments and responsibilities, and attend all church events. This schedule is rigorous and filled with activities both planned as well as unexpected. This will be a fast-paced year that will result in tremendous growth in the students' lives. In order to make the best use of this opportunity, the students must assign their highest priority to the Master's Commission. This is a commitment for the entire year. It is a solemn commitment, first and foremost to God. Two breaks are scheduled during the year; Christmas and Spring Break.

COURSE CURRICULUM

The Master's Commission is designed to develop in each student the spiritual maturity and Christ-like character necessary to represent the Kingdom of God on the earth and be world changers. The students' relationship with the Lord will grow as they learn who He is as a Holy and loving God and who they are in light of Him being their Father.

The general course involves:

1. Memorizing 10 – 12 Scriptures per week.
2. Reading through the entire Bible chronologically in one year.
3. Oral presentations by the students.
4. Personal application papers based on class topics.
5. Daily serving and outreach opportunities.
6. Serving and ministering in various churches.
7. Summer ministry tour.
8. Practical living skills. (cooking, basic car care, etc.)
9. Training in ministry and the arts. (music, drama, mime, dance)
10. Fund raising projects and trips.

Current World Affairs (CWA)

Class Purpose:

- Envisioning and equipping sons and daughters to be World Changers and History Makers.
- To develop the ability to declare the transforming message of the Kingdom to individuals, families, cities, churches and nations.
- To develop discernment into current ideologies and their impact on current world affairs: with the ability to apply biblical principles to issues which affect individuals and the nations.

Course Involvement:

Three class hours per week of teaching from subjects including: Worldviews, History of Western Civilization, Postmodernism, The Infallible Word of God, World Religions, World Affairs and Foreign Policy. Students will read from *Postmodern Times* and *Liberating the Nations*. In addition, students may publish a current affairs research paper, dealing with a social issue from both a secular and biblical perspective. Smaller assignments will be assigned to develop the ability to be active in the jurisdiction of civil government.

OUTREACH / SERVING THE CHURCH /OTHER ACTIVITIES

1. OUTREACH VISION STATEMENT

We believe that all followers of Christ have a responsibility to reach out and represent Him in their communities. Christ Himself commanded, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Recognizing that God did not save us just for our own sakes, we determine to lay down our lives for the sake of the lost. The leadership of CCK has emphasized the need for us to break out and be enlisted in service to the community with the goals of reproducing the seed God has planted in us, penetrating our culture, and proclaiming the Lord's favor.

When Jesus Christ came to earth, He brought with Him the Kingdom of God. He then commissioned His followers to establish it upon the earth. Therefore, we do not represent ourselves, nor our own agenda, as we work where we see the Father working. We in no way claim to have all the answers. We will simply obey and be faithful in the places the Lord has given us. In being the light of Christ to our community, we will minister to people the way that He did. He met the physical needs of the individuals as well as the spiritual. It is the whole person that needs this ministry.

Above all, we seek to do the will of our Father God in reaching out to those in need. We will carry His heart for the lost as we fulfill the Great Commission and bring the Kingdom of God to the culture.

2. GROUP OUTREACHES

- A. KIRKLAND CITY HALL: Students help with clerical work at the city, such as answering phones, filing paper work and various other responsibilities.
- B. BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB: Various needs are met by students as they help clean the facilities, play with kids, tutor, and monitor activities.
- C. LUNCH BUDDIES: Each student is paired with a local elementary student for weekly lunch time when they can play with and get to know their "buddy".
- D. SPECIAL DELIVERY: In this home for unwed mothers, students have the opportunity to serve through various work projects.
- E. PRAYER WALKING: The students have an opportunity each week to prayer walk in the city to see the atmosphere of Heaven come to earth!
- F. CATHOLIC COMMUNITY SERVICES: This service organizes weekly projects to assist elderly and low income families with various household needs. Students enjoy the opportunity to serve these people on a weekly basis.
- G. ASSISTED LIVING HOME: Each week students volunteer at a local assisted living home, helping with practical projects and building relationally with residents.

3. SERVING IN THE CHURCH

- Weekly cleaning and maintenance of CCK
- Working for people in the church with various needs
- Childcare
- Serving at the CCK church office
- Serving in children's ministries
- Serving at church meetings and special events

4. VARIOUS MASTER'S COMMISSION ACTIVITIES

The Master's Commission students are regularly involved in numerous ministries within the church body as well as a few outside of the classroom. These include the following:

CHRIST CHURCH ACADEMY CHAPEL: Occasionally on Thursday morning the Master's Commission joins with the secondary students from our K-12 Academy. This is one of many scheduled times available for the students to get to know and impact the generation following behind them.

GENERATIONS CHURCH: The Master's Commission students join the parents and youth group on the first Wednesday evening of each month to worship and train together.

DRAMA & ARTS TRAINING: At a date selected by the director, the students will begin to train in the area of the arts. A few hours a week, the students will be instructed in both the biblical foundation for the arts as well as practical application. This will include, but is not limited to dance, drama, skits, rhythm, songs, and mime. This time of training will increase in the spring in preparation for the summer tour.

MINISTRY TRAINING: Students will gain training and practical experience in corporate and one on one ministry. They will learn to; express and minister the gifts of the spirit, correctly handle words of knowledge, deliver prophetic words maturely, receive and process prophetic words they receive personally. They will also learn to prepare and deliver relevant personal testimony professing what God has done in their life and what He has accomplished in them during their year of Master's Commission.

ZIKLAG: Ziklag is a ministry which seeks to train men to walk with integrity, accountability, responsibility and honor, equipping them to be godly leaders in their homes and communities. Led by the Pastors and intern men, the course lasts for three months, and involves Bible study, face to face accountability and strong relationship building.

VIRTUA: This is a seven week course where the student and intern girls gather together in the director's home one night a week. Led by the director's wife, they enjoy worship, waiting on the Lord, and personal ministry. There is also teaching, discussion, and prayer concerning such topics as identity, purpose, and the role of a woman.

SUMMER TOUR OF MINISTRY: As well as various opportunities through out the year at local churches and schools, the Master's Commission goes on an extended ministry trip in the spring or summer. This trip can last from 4-6 weeks and travel can be around the U.S. or abroad. This is definitely one of the highlights of the year as the students get the opportunity to give out what they have received during their year.

SOCCER CAMP: During the summer the students serve as counselors at Heavenly Goals Soccer Camp in the Seattle area, and lead the evening chapel services.

CORPORATE PRAYER MEETINGS: Students attend various weekly corporate prayer meetings through the year. They learn the purpose of prayer, strategies in prayer, and their authority in prayer.

FUNDRAISING: Several times a year Students participate in Business Conferences as hired temporary labor to raise money supplementing their tuition. They are primarily hired through EventForce, a local company.

MASTER'S COMMISSION GUIDELINES

GUIDELINES FOR PERSONAL GROWTH

The guidelines for personal growth are purposefully designed to draw the students into the center of God's presence and to enhance their relationships with others by teaching them to show preference to one another. This year will be unlike any year they ever experience. Father is desiring to meet His sons and daughters like never before. Students have an opportunity to demonstrate their desire for God by laying down certain things for the year they are in the program. The students leave their families, their churches, their friends, and their comfort zones to invest a year into finding God. He often tests their willingness to surrender all to Him by asking them to pay a price. Our desire is to see the students maximize their year in the program by removing as many of the 'stumbling stones' and distractions as possible. The following guidelines help to foster the growth of the student:

Schedule & Availability

1. The student is expected to be available for work or assignments six days and/or nights per week and as needs arise.

Due to frequent changes in scheduling, flexibility is a key. Jesus' ministry was characterized by inconveniences. Some of the greatest miracles occurred as a result of interruptions. Being flexible opens the door to divine opportunities.

2. The student is expected to attend all church meetings, including Sunday services, church conferences and equipping opportunities, and Generations Church on the first Wednesday of the month. They will be saturated this year with worship and the Word.

3. Students are not allowed to take leave from the Master's Commission's yearly schedule, except for Christmas vacation and Spring break. Permission may be granted for special occasions. Students and their families will need to plan on one year of consecration to the Lord.

The staff feels the responsibility to provide maximum opportunities for corporate growth and experience in the Master's Commission. If a student misses these growth opportunities, they find themselves lacking significant events that lead to the benefit of one full year of the Master's Commission. It is understood that families do sometimes experience traumatic events and may need their son or daughter home for a brief time.

4. Students must sit in the designated Master's Commission area during church services.

The Master's Commission serves practically on Sunday mornings and the students have to be available should needs arise surrounding the service. This also provides students the opportunity to be involved in the service "up close and personal".

5. Monday will be the student's day off. Any student planning to go out of town on their day off must seek permission from the directors.

On a normal week students are involved in Master's Commission activities every day of the week and they need a day of rest. We encourage students not to fill Mondays with activities but take a longer time with the Lord and get physically and spiritually filled up.

6. Any type of commitment by a student, work or pleasure, must be approved ahead of time. Any approval of this type will be subject to cancellation if it is in the best interest of the Master's Commission. All doctor's appointments must be pre-approved and scheduled on the student's day off unless it is an emergency.

The staff must monitor activities in order to protect the student's health.

7. Curfew: Sunday night 12:00 AM
 Mon-Sat nights 11:00 PM

Curfew is designed to insure a proper amount of rest so students will be ready for a full day's schedule. Furthermore the student's time with the Lord in the morning is key. It is one of the most important disciplines students will learn during the year.

8. Students are expected to be at least 10 minutes early for all meetings. This includes morning prayer and all church services. Be prompt for all classes and daily activities.

Practicing punctuality demonstrates honor to classmates as well as leaders and speakers both in the Master's Commission and outside of it.

9. If for any reason the student is unable to attend a daily session, please contact the Assistant Director before 9:00 PM of the night before. A very good reason will be required.

It is important for the program to be aware when students are not able to participate in daily activities.

10. Vacation guidelines for out-of-town students:

- a. Notify directors of vacation plans before they are finalized and airline tickets are purchased.
- b. Make appeals for special circumstances.
- c. If possible, students should spend part of the vacation with their Host Family.
- d. No singles or small groups staying alone without prior permission.

Vacations are a testing time of what the student has learned during the MC year. The staff feels the necessity to help students be completely successful and victorious in their break times; therefore it is important to help monitor vacation plans.

Stewardship & Courtesy

11. Students are asked to refrain from: roughhousing, coarse jesting, crass jokes, and negative sarcasm.

12. Students' vehicles must be properly maintained, cleaned and insured. Inspections will be performed weekly.

13. Car repairs and insurance are not the responsibility of the Master's Commission and must be maintained by the student.

The Master's Commission will cover oil changes for those using their vehicles for carpool. The student carpool fund will cover carpool gas and oil expenses and is funded out of the student's monthly support.

14. Drivers and passengers in any vehicle must obey all traffic laws (including seatbelts, speed limits, etc).

15. Students may not call pastors or interns on their day off **unless it is an emergency.**

The staff needs a day off just as the students do. Please plan ahead when needing to communicate with interns or pastors.

16. Students are responsible to keep the Master's Commission's classroom clean at all times. The office is for staff use only.

The classroom is used for much more than just Master's Commission class time and should be kept free of clutter and personal belongings when students are not in class.

17. Students are asked to show respect by being quiet near the church offices and the pastors' offices.

It is important to maintain a professional and quiet atmosphere around the church offices. The Master's Commission is only one of many other ministries in the building. Students must adapt to the environment, not create it.

Health & Hygiene

18. To help maintain good health, students are required to do regular exercise each week. For safety's sake women are not permitted to exercise outdoors alone.

Students spend a lot of time in a classroom setting. It is important to remain physically active and fit.

19. Students are expected to practice basic personal hygiene.

20. There is no drug, alcohol or tobacco use permitted at any time.

Media

21. Computer Use Guidelines:

- Students may not use church computers without expressed permission from MC staff.
- Students may not use host families computer without expressed permission from host family.
- Internet/email use is limited to 30 minutes a day (this includes cell phone internet use).
- There is to be no exclusive guy/girl communication through email, instant message, facebook, twitter, etc.

Computers are a wonderful tool as well as a tempting distraction. It is vital for the students to feed the spirit and set aside things that fill up the soul.

22. Telephone Use (Home, Church and Cell Phone) Guidelines.

- Students must keep phone calls to a maximum of five minutes; however, they may talk to parents or immediate family longer. Calls must be made after 8:00AM and before 9:30PM.
- Cell phones must be turned off during MC hours. Leave cell phones in vehicle outside of building.
- There are to be no guy/girl phone calls or texting.

23. This is a year to saturate your life with the Lord. Therefore, we ask that the students only listen to music that glorifies the Lord and promotes worship.

Music is a powerful draw either to the Lord or away from Him. It is necessary for the students to come into the Master's Commission year listening only to music that draws them to Him and builds up their spirit.

24. There is a no television, movies or videos, or computer games policy. Computer use will be under the discretion of the Host Family and staff. This is a year for the students to saturate their mind with God's Word, making it sensitive to His promptings. Whatever is put into the mind affects the spirit.

Again, what goes in will affect the spiritual growth of the students during this year of consecration.

Consequences

25. Students late for prayer, classes, services, or jobs earn MC Club and are required to perform additional work on their time off.

Practicing punctuality demonstrates honor and respect for staff and classmate's time as well as those involved in teaching/sharing with the Master's Commission.

26. It is the student's responsibility to complete and hand in assignments and requirements on time. If these requirements are not met, the student will earn MC Club.

The Master's Commission is a leadership school; therefore, it is designed to help teach self-government and personal responsibility.

Miscellaneous

27. If a Host Family is going to be out of town at any time during the year, the student needs to contact a staff member. When necessary, we will secure housing. Please contact us at least a week in advance.

28. Under the guidance of a leader, students may pray for and minister to those of the same gender only, unless in a group (even then they need to be under covering and use discretion).

When in a service or meeting students must check a word with the leader of the meeting before sharing. When giving a word to a fellow student, they must check it with an intern first.

GUIDELINES FOR LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

Whether they are living at home or with another family, we ask the students to keep in mind that it is a tremendous privilege to be there. Host Families sacrifice greatly in order to enable the students to dedicate themselves to God for one year. The student is asked to have a teachable spirit and develop a sensitivity to how the home they are staying in functions. They will be a great blessing to the family if they are teachable. The students are also asked to live by the Golden Rule (Matthew 7:12), and be considerate at all times. Home life is a far more accurate measure of one's growth in God than how one lives anywhere else. In that spirit, the student is asked to follow these guidelines:

1. Students will be waking up early each morning for classes, church, and work. They need to be very quiet in the morning to avoid disturbing family members who are sleeping. This means no singing in the shower, playing music, slamming doors, talking loudly, etc.
2. Students need to be modest at all times. A student may wear a robe if it is acceptable with their family. Otherwise, they must be fully dressed.
3. If students have a radio or stereo in their room, keep the volume down or use headphones. Don't use headphones in the presence of others. This includes iPods.
4. If students are the last one to bed at night, they need to be very quiet and make sure all lights, fans, etc., are turned off, and doors are locked.
5. Students need to do their own laundry weekly. They are asked to arrange with their Host Family for a specific time to complete it.
6. When students see something that needs to be done, they should not wait to be asked or put it off, they should DO IT! Students are expected to participate in household chores like sweeping, vacuuming, dishes, yard work, etc, and helping around the house is not limited to Saturdays only. If a student uses up something that can be easily remade (lemonade, tea, juice, ice, etc.), they need to re-make it. If a student spills or makes a mess, they need to clean up after themselves.
7. If a student will not be home for dinner, they need to call ahead of time (during lunch break) and advise their parents or Host Family of their schedule, especially changes. It is the student's responsibility to know and communicate their schedule to their Host Family.
8. Students must get prior approval from parents/hosts before inviting people over and should always ask in private.
9. Students need to be considerate of their Host Family's needs. Food costs money, and most people have budgeted a certain amount for food. Students may not eat anything without permission, unless advised differently by their Host Parents. Students must recognize that electricity, water, gas, etc., is expensive and should use it wisely.
10. If there is a legitimate need for a curfew extension, permission may be given by the Host Family or Master's Commission staff.
11. On the student's day off, they need to maintain a disciplined lifestyle of sleep. "Redeeming the time..." (Ephesians 5:16). "A little sleep, a little slumber..." (Proverbs 24:33). Morning curfew is established by the directors if needed.
12. Students must keep their room clean every day. Students are required to make their bed daily. They need to keep other areas of the home that they use clean at all times. Students should pick up around the house wherever they see the need. Students should ask for particular ways to bless their Host Family.

13. Students need to set aside one night a week for family night, preferably Sunday or Monday. God wants them to find the balance of both relationships: classmates and Host Families. Both are priority. Communication is the key to finding that balance.
14. Thursday nights are set aside to baby-sit for Host Families, attend congregation meetings or home groups.
15. In addition to daily small chores, students are required to do weekly chores. Saturday from 9AM-12PM is designated for home chores assigned by the student's family. If there is a change in the schedule, students are required to arrange another time to do their chores.
16. Students are not allowed to honk when picking up members of their carpool. This shows respect for the person that is being picked up and honors the family members and neighbors who may be sleeping.
17. Students may not ask their families for rides and are required to use their carpools.
18. Host Families cover expenses for general room and board only. The student is required to utilize their monthly allowance to pay for personal items, carpool expenses, and phone calls.
19. Students may not speak about their Host Family in a negative way to anyone. No complaining to parents, siblings, or pastoral staff without first applying the Matthew 18 principle will be tolerated.

In conclusion, students must respect the wishes and authority of their host parents. This is an opportunity to love and be loved. Students should make it their goal to truly become a son/daughter of the home they are living in.

DRESS GUIDELINES

The Master's Commission students are ministers representing Jesus Christ. All dress should reflect Him and not a certain look. Young men are asked to wear clothing that displays masculinity; young women are asked to wear clothing that displays femininity. Dress reflects the condition of the heart. The students are asked to dress in a way which reflects honor to the Lord and each other.

HAIR

Women Hairstyle and coloring must be conservative and in good taste.
Men Neat. Trimmed. Well-kept.

JEWELRY

Women Jewelry must be in good taste - not gaudy. Earrings are for ears only. No other body piercing jewelry is acceptable.
Men Jewelry must be conservative - rings, watches, bracelets and simple neck chains only.

TATTOOS

No tattoos or any other body markings may be acquired during the Master's Commission year. We may ask for a covering to be worn over certain existing tattoos, when necessary

DRESS FOR SUNDAY CHURCH

Women Dresses, skirts and dress shoes
Men Dress slacks (no jeans or cargo style pants), dress shirts, ties and dress shoes

DRESS FOR EVENING CHURCH MEETINGS (Congregation meeting, Generations Church, etc.)

Women Nice casual attire (no jeans, no T-shirts and no tennis shoes)
Men Nice casual attire (no jeans, no T-shirts and no tennis shoes)

DRESS FOR MORNING CLASSES AND OUTREACHES

Casual attire- nice jeans, warm-ups and tennis shoes allowed.
Women No T-shirts (feminine shirts, sweaters and blouses are acceptable)
Men Shirts must have collars

Make sure you have a change of work clothes with you. Work attire must be modest, clean, and appropriate for the task (closed toed work shoes only). Shorts may be worn during the summer time with MC Staff permission, but no cutoffs, short-shorts, tight shorts or sports shorts; shorts should be walking length.

No sweatshirts. No flip-flops. Shoes must be worn at all times.

Women's dress and skirt length should be modest. No halter tops or tight clothing—modest tank tops only (no spaghetti straps). Modest bathing suits for men and women when swimming or boating. Fashionable hats are acceptable, no baseball hats or beanies during class time or church meetings.

REMEMBER - YOU ARE A MINISTER REPRESENTING JESUS CHRIST!

RELATIONSHIP GUIDELINES

These guidelines are to protect and strengthen your relationship with the Lord and to protect your integrity as a disciple. With these guidelines, it will be easier to maintain a more unified group of disciples. They are not intended to break up or keep you from godly relationships. Our goal this year is to secure and maintain an undistracted devotion to Christ. Therefore:

1. There will be no guy-girl pairing off while in group settings.
2. The affection or attention shown to any one member of the Master's Commission is expected to be the same as that shown to everyone else in the group.
3. There will be no riding together alone unless previously approved by the Master's Commission staff.
4. There will be **No Dating!** A "date" is when two people of the opposite sex arrange to be together, either alone or in a group setting.
5. Necessary phone conversations shall comply with telephone use guidelines (must be under five minutes).
6. Only groups with an unequal guy-girl ratio are permitted.
7. There will be no emailing, text messaging or instant messaging members of the opposite sex.

These guidelines apply to relationships with people either in or out of the Master's Commission. If you have any questions about these guidelines, please talk with the MC Staff.

Forming relationships (friendship or marriage) is each generation's toughest challenge. Undistracted Devotion is designed to help parents and youth discover a higher way in forming relationships than what we have copied from our culture. When we consider the many so called friendships that do not serve the purposes of God, and marriages that fail at the same percentage as the world without God, we must begin to do something different. Undistracted Devotion is a sixteen year journey to change the culture of the church in how it forms relationships. It is a journey to see relationships formed in a manner that produces exemplary results worthy of Christ. When you attend Master's Commission you will be exposed to what we at CCK have learned and walk in with joy and gratefulness. We trust you will be a part of a new generation of warriors who will embrace, for the sake of your generation, the message of Undistracted Devotion. It will make a difference in your life and empower you with a message of hope for your generation.

REQUIRED ITEMS TO BE OBTAINED BEFORE STUDENT ORIENTATION

1. Passport that is valid for the school year
2. Absentee voter registration ballot completed and submitted per individual home state requirements
2. Work shoes or boots
3. Work clothes, work gloves
4. Lunch box and food containers labeled with student's name
5. Bible—New American Standard (NAS), New International Version (NIV), or New King James Version (NKJV)
6. School bag or backpack
7. Suitcase (no larger than 19" wide x 10" deep x 26" tall)—Pullman style, non-duffel type.
8. Sleeping bag (with stuff sack) and pillow
9. Water bottle (able to hold one or two quarts)
10. Toiletries
11. Necessary clothing for the year (see dress guidelines)
16. Modest swim wear
17. **One all-white, collared (oxford style) cotton shirt** to be used for serving at church events

Fundraiser Conference Uniform:

- **2 pair black cotton (Dockers-style) pants (not cargo style)**
- **COMFORTABLE black shoes (2 pair recommended)**
- **Black socks (5 pair minimum)**
- **Solid black belt**
- **Six black crew-neck under-shirts**

An insured vehicle for student's own transportation needs (i.e. day off, breaks, etc.), would be extremely beneficial.

FINANCIAL BREAKDOWN

The total cost of the Master's Commission program for the year is **\$6,500.00**

This amount is due by Student Orientation night in September.

All tuition and student monthly support monies must be given or sent directly to the Master's Commission. The individuals giving the money will not receive a contribution credit due to Internal Revenue Service requirements.

Included in this cost is the following:

Application Fee:

- \$100 non-refundable application fee **to be sent in with application.**
- This fee is subtracted from the total cost if the applicant is accepted into the program

Tuition:

- All curriculum costs
- Most school supplies
- General church liability insurance
- Graduation expenses (diploma, ring, etc.)
- Summer Mission Trip
- Uniforms for Drama & Arts ministry
- **Personal Monthly Support**
 - \$100 of monthly support given to the student on the 1st of every month to be used for transportation and personal needs.
 - Each student is required to have \$100.00 per month of support, which is included in their tuition cost. However, students may choose to raise, up to an additional \$100.00 per month of support, either through personal savings or outside contribution.

Refunds

A partial refund may be granted should a student not complete a full year in the Master's Commission. The amount refunded during the initial two weeks is 80% of the total fees. During the third, fourth, and fifth weeks after induction, the refund decreases to 70% of the total fees. During the sixth and seventh weeks, the refund decreases to 60% of the total fees. Finally, the amount refunded will decrease to 40% of total fees during the eighth and ninth weeks. After the ninth week, if a student chooses not to complete the year, there will be no refund.

Housing

Housing is provided by host families of Christ Church Kirkland at no cost to the students.
